# News from the Parish Chairman

**Action in flood risks:** Its good to see actions resulting from the Parish Council's long and determined efforts to get Suffolk County Council to seriously address the risk of flooding at Church Street. Following the works to clear the watercourse along Stour Brook and the removal of some trees and vegetation on the church side bank, the drainage along the bottom of Church Street is now having a much needed and long awaited overhaul. Despite some frustrations caused by the day time road closure and poor signage regarding accessibility during the evenings, we look forward to the completion of the works and anticipate improvements in future downpours.

**Meldham Bridge and the flood reservoir:** The Parish Council has been in touch with the Environment Agency regarding the growing problems with excessive vehicle use at the Meldham Bridge entrance to the West Park reservoir. Rubbish accumulation, unauthorised access, overnight camping have all been cited. We have been reassured that action is being taken and improvement are planned. We have also become aware of a growing problem of dog waste and rubbish along the walkways and that currently no agency is accepting responsibility for its collection. We will be pursuing this issue and asking both County and Borough councils to find a solution.

**Broadband:** Another step forward into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century has also been realised this month with high speed Broadband finally on tap in the village. Parish residents in Hanchett End and the Arboretum probably can't quite appreciate the impact of below 1 Mb download speeds typically suffered by villagers over recent years. Now with the two hubs installed there are reports of up to 70 Mb, but typically 25 – 30 Mbs with most providers. However, residents need to be aware that they will have to contact their provider to upgrade their package if they want to take advantage of the higher speeds.

**The Haverhill Research Park:** Residents at the Arboretum have had an anxious couple of months as the owners of the Research Park site sought to have planning conditions restricting the site to research and hotel use removed. This would have allowed the sites to be used for light industrial, with the inevitable outcome being that heavy vehicles would be using the estate road as the only access to the two largest sites. However I am delighted to say that our arguments against the proposal carried weight with borough Councillors and on 12<sup>th</sup> March St Edmundsbury Borough Council's Development Control Committee voted 8 - 3 to reject the applicant's proposal, However Planning Officers have asked that members consider the matter further next month and a site meeting for Councillors is due to be held shortly. The Parish Council will continue to press our objections.

**Parish Council Vacancy:** Thanks to Geoff Hayward who has had to stand down from the council due to work commitments. His work in pressing for action on traffic issues has been valuable. This means that we have a vacancy for another co-optee to join the Parish Council. # Rectory Rambles

I write this as Lent reaches a mid point with Mothering Sunday and we begin the process of Lent when we turn our thoughts towards the Holy Week and Easter season, the Paschal mystery of triumph, betrayal, suffering, death and resurrection.

This is the most important time of the Church's year, at time when all Christians should make extra efforts to come and be with the Church congregation to celebrate, remember, and pray.

Details of Holy Week and Easter services around the Benefice are in this publication. Please make use of the extra services offered for you.

On Palm Sunday, we celebrate the first joy of the season, as we celebrate Our Lord's triumphant entrance into Jerusalem where he was welcomed by crowds worshiping him and laying down palm leaves before him. It also marks the beginning of Holy Week, with the greatest tragedy and sorrow of the year.

Jesus' triumphant return to Jerusalem is only one side of the story.

By now many of the Jews are filled with hate for Our Lord. They want to see him stoned, calling Him a blasphemer, especially after offering proof of His Divinity during a winter visit to Jerusalem for the Feast of the Dedication.

After this, Jesus went to Perea, where he was summoned to Bethany. There he raised Lazarus from the dead, a miracle Jesus took refuge at Ephraim returning six days before Passover to Bethany, triumphantly entering Jerusalem. That evening, He leaves Jerusalem and returns Monday. He spent time with Gentiles in the Temple, and on Wednesday left for the Mount of Olives. Here he foretold the apostles the events of the next several days, including His impending death.

He returned to Jerusalem on Thursday, to share the Last Supper with His apostles. He was subsequently arrested and tried. He was crucified at Calvary on Friday, outside the gates of Jerusalem.

He was buried the same day, and arose three days later, on Easter Sunday.

All of this is done by our Lord for forgiveness of our sins, and for life everlasting with Him. God so loved us, that He sent His only begotten Son to die for us, so that our sins maybe forgiven.

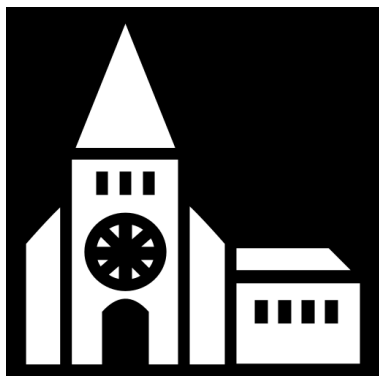

# SAVE A LIFE

**Withersfield now has its own Public Assess Defibrillator (PAD) which is located in the yellow cabinet on the outside of the village hall to the right of the main front door.**

A defibrillator also known as a DEFIB or an AED (automated external defibrillator) they all mean the same thing, is a machine that could restart a person's heart in cardiac arrest. They are available in train stations, shopping centres, leisure centres, towns and villages as well as many other locations. You shouldn't be afraid of using a defibrillator if someone has had a cardiac arrest.

**23 villagers** recently attended a free 2 hour BHF Heartstart course to learn lifesaving skills including CPR, choking, bleeding and how to use a defibrillator. The courses were supported by the parish council and instructed by local residents Mark Milsom (Air ambulance paramedic) and Dr Fiona Andrews. **Further courses are planned during the year and anyone interested should email the parish council to book a place.**

You **do not** have to be a firefighter to use a fire extinguisher; you **do not** have to be a paramedic to use a defibrillator. In cases of cardiac arrest a defibrillator is a vital piece of life saving equipment that can be used by anybody. All you have to do is follow the prompts as it instructs you when you switch it on. The software in the defibrillator decides if the casualty requires a shock, and prompts you to deliver it when required. **Early Cardio- Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and the use of a defibrillator can increase a person's chances of surviving a cardiac arrest by as much as 70%.** When you call 999 the ambulance service will inform you of the nearest defibrillator and give you a code if it is located in a cabinet. Send someone to collect the defibrillator whilst CPR is maintained.

**The first few minutes of a cardiac arrest are vital. Every minute of delay is a 10% reduction in chances of survival.**

## **Know your DRsABC**

- D** – Danger (ensure it is safe to approach)
- R** – Response (check the patient for a response)
- s** – Shout for help (do not leave the patient at this stage)
- A** – Airway (open the airway tilting the head backwards)
- B** – Breathing (Check if the patient is breathing normally)
- C** – CPR (dial 999 and start CPR ask if there is a defib available)

## Spring is the start of the Bee Keepers New Year!

- On a warm day (12 deg) have a look in the brood chamber for any eggs, grubs and sealed brood.
- Add feed syrup to build up the brood to maximise the number of flying bees by mid-June. This is start of the honey flow!
- Clean & replace old combe in the supers and dark brood frames ready to put on the hives as needed.
- Clear the floors by raking out any debris.
- Time to treat VEROA.
- Clear any vegetation from around the hive to help air circulation.
- If you wish to breed, time to think about which hives to use.

Here you are asked to fill in a simple on-line form and to mark on a map exactly where the problem is.

You will be able to see if it has been previously reported and the map will show the level of priority that has been given to a reported problem.

The winter weather has left us with lots of damaged roads—dangerous to all road users and pedestrians—but especially lethal to cyclists—everyone can do their bit to ensure that we keep our County Council highways team informed and on the ball.

# The provision of a children's play area in Withersfield

At the Parish Council meeting in January a member of the community asked the Council to look into the provision of a small children's play area in the village as there are currently no facilities for the younger children on the village greens or the sports ground. As a result I was asked to undertake a review of issues involved. Having spoken to the local authorities and neighbouring parishes it became clear that the first steps in developing this project was to establish if there was a genuine need and desire among villagers for a play area. We will need detailed and persuasive quantitative and qualitative research, to obtain the necessary permissions and convince the local authority of the need as well as obtaining grants and funding. It will also require some kind of community consultation to establish the design and equipment to be used. Great Thurlow created a petition to demonstrate support in the village and used community events such as the annual fete to gather signatures and as a result, they have a wonderful facility on their sports ground (see picture below)

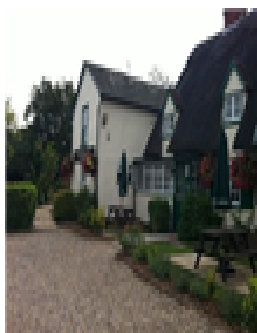

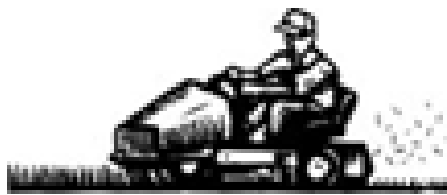
